Fair on the Square RALLY 2016 Huntsville State Park, Huntsville, TX by Rae Gilbert

If what they say is true; "When you're lucky, you're lucky" then TCPU is blessed. Clear skies and temperatures in the low 80's during the day and down to 60 in the mornings is just what the Hosts were wanting. Despite the fact that a rumor was going around that there was "some kind of a dance that was done during a full moon" — and one will never know, prayers are answered. Huntsville State Park is just a great place to camp. If you missed this rally, check it out when you have an opportunity. This 2,083 acre park lies just south of Huntsville off I-45 at Exit 109. Boating, (canoe and kayak rental available as well), fishing in Lake Raven which boasts bass, catfish, perch, and some crappie, birding, hiking, biking ,or just simply sitting at the campsite under the shade trees watching the water and relaxing is wonderful. We even observed an alligator at the fishing pier. He was trying for the bait and sometimes the catch. Several folks saw gators from their kayaks as well. Sunrises and sunsets were great. Our rally was divided between a nice screened shelter with picnic tables, electricity and lights and the Lodge, built by the Civilian Conservation Corps. The Lodge has a wonderful patio, but no fire ring. The inside has a fireplace and a full kitchen and plenty of room for a rally.

Thursday our Hosts: Ronn & Rae Gilbert and Stephen & KD Couch were joined by: Bob & Dorothy Cooney, Alan & Bernadine Billard (Ashley was busy earning THREE Gold Medals in swimming. Congrats!) Lyle & Peggy Snow, Bill & Dorma Kindle, Red & Nancy Childers, Jerry & Tracey Calvert, Russell & Nancy Dionne, Tom & Caron Bundy, Vernon & Jo Goodwin, and Jim & Barbara Mercer. In addition, Robert & Lisa Hansen (members of TAHI) and Ron & Janice Lange from Huntsville (hopefully newest members) joined the group. We all headed to the Group Shelter and Happy hour commenced. Our Hosts served chili with all the toppings and fritos. Ice cream and brownies topped off the meal. We all enjoyed the waterfront view and cooler breezes. By 7:30 it was getting dark, so luminaries were by the steps. Thanks KD and Steven for making your neighbors drink all that milk! HA

Friday a tour of the TEXAS PRISON MUSEUM was planned for 10:30. It was just off I-45 at Exit 118. Thirteen couples traveled to the Museum. What a treat. It's mostly a self-guided tour, but we were fortunate to have a talk by Jim Willet, former Warden of the Walls Unit. Walls was named for its twenty foot high red brick walls. It was the oldest Texas prison and opened in 1849. Originally only Caucasians were housed here as the only penalties available to Blacks was whipping and hanging. Inside the Walls was the textile factory where prisoners produced tents and uniforms for the Confederate forces during the Civil war. "OLD SPARKY" (the electric chair) was housed here from 1924-1964. From 1982 until present time, executions were done by lethal injections. Huntsville has the most active execution chamber in the United States with 537 executions as of 4/16. The displays are very well done. A gun found in the death car of Bonnie and Clyde, prison contraband showing the craftiness and cleverness of prisoners to hide weapons, inmate artwork and articles of leather craft and woodwork and wood carving are very interesting. We all enjoyed learning about and some even remembered attending the PRISON RODEO. It was a very popular event. Bareback basketball, bronco riding, bull riding, calf roping and wild cow milking were some of the events.

began in 1931 and continued until 1981. The money brought in was utilized for prisoner education and other programs. It is said that it ended because the State began getting funds from the federal government for these programs. Also, the stadium was in need of repair, and the legislature felt it was not affordable. If you ever see the film URBAN COWBOY, the Rodeo is featured in the film. Several made purchases in the gift shop.

After the tour, folks went to lunch and other places. When we returned to the campground we were joined by: Steve & Ginger Zeringue, Rob & Nelda Tope, Jerry & Irene Lyddon, and on Saturday by the Reeves. Dinner was in the Lodge built partially by the Civilian Conservation Corps. They worked in the park constructing the boathouse, the dam and spillway, and some cabins. Lake Raven was formed from the dam. WWII ended the CCC work but the Works Progress Administration workers and others completed many projects. Guess we need to reinstate the CCC? Ginger told of how her great grandmother and grandfather lived on the lodge site. Her great grandmother prepared meals for the campers etc. Our dinner was served by members of the TCPU "CHAIN GANG". Our hosts provided each unit with a roasted chicken and then potato salad, baked beans and dessert were available. Everyone continued to enjoy visiting with one another and meeting with new folks.

Saturday morning, a breakfast of French toast, sausage, and orange juice was served. We wanted folks to have stamina for the FAIR ON THE SQUARE. The Chamber of Commerce gave us a tip that many followed: park in the stadium lot at the college and catch a free shuttle to the fair. It ran every 15-20 minutes. EASY. FAIR ON THE SQUARE happens the First Saturday in October. WOW, 350 booths, a food court, wine tasting, a beer garden, live entertainment and so many craft booths. Overwhelming to say the least. Some folks took in the Sam Houston Museum and the Sam Houston Statue. You have probably all seen it at one time or another. If you have traveled north on I-45. "GENERAL SAM HOUSTON FOUGHT FOR TEXAS INDEPENDENCE." This is the tallest statue of an American Hero. This "Tribute to Courage" is a 67 ft. statue and it stands on a 10 foot granite base. They say one can see it from six miles away. The Chamber still has brick pavers for sale (\$100-\$5000) and the proceeds go to maintaining the statue.

Saturday night a salad and baked potato bar was served for dinner with a nice assortment of cookies. Jim Mercer had the drawing for our "Red, White, and Blue" charity. The "Chain Gang" wines and the tee shirts (THE WARDEN IS ALWAYS RIGHT...I AM THE WARDEN, and OLD SPARKY) seemed to be popular. We are now referring to Steve Zeringue as "Old Sparky" and Eloise as "the Warden." LOL Don Reeves reviewed his rally schedule and recruited for co-hosts. Looks to be another fun year ahead. Check out his schedule to see where you can volunteer to fill a need.

Sunday morning we were back at the screened shelter. Everyone graciously brought their own coffee and egg/sausage sandwich, banana nut bread, and left over French toast and sausage were served with orange juice. AND THEN... another treat. Steven Couch gave a wonderful devotional. It was an interaction for all to get to know others better. Questions were asked of the group like: "ALL WHO HAVE READ A GOOD BOOK IN THE LAST SIX MONTHS STAND IN THIS GROUP"; to "WHO HAS CAMPED IN FIVE OR MORE NATIONAL PARKS?" After the fourteen questions we certainly knew each other much better. It was fun and we thank you, Steven.




