We were able to enjoy a nice dinner from the great left overs from the rally. We had heavy rains that night, but they stopped long enough for us to get back on the road to Big Bend. On the way to Big Bend, Mom (Barbara) got a picture of our caravan crossing the Pecos River Bridge. It is the tallest bridge in Texas, and our Airstreams looked awesome crossing it. Once at Big Bend, we stayed at Stillwell Ranch RV. This place has a really interesting history and was originally part of the ranch owned by Roy and Hallie Stillwell. Hallie has written a couple of books about her life on the ranch from 1918 until her death in 1997. The RV park even had a museum dedicated to her life. The RV park also had lots of wildlife around it. There were so many strange birds, much different from those we have in the swamps. We saw lots of Scaled Quail, Cactus Wren, and Roadrunners. Mom (Barbara) even saw a bobcat there and almost got a perfect picture. He ran away before she got a second chance. I think they were both scared!

Big Bend National Park is huge as we soon learned. Everyone decided to just do their own thing and see the things they were most interested in seeing or doing. Everyone loved the Santa Elena Canyon of the Rio Grande and Mom & Dad enjoyed hiking the Lost Mine Trail in the Chisos Basin. Everyone enjoyed a meal together at the Chisos Lodge and watching the sunset through The Window. The cactus was blooming all across the desert. There were yellow, red, bright pink, and orange blooms. They were beautiful, just don't try to pick a bouquet! I was amazed at all the living things that can thrive in the desert. We saw deer, rabbits, javelina, bobcat, and bears. The Lyddons spotted the bears playing in the road on their way out of Chisos Basin. We also saw many wildflowers and even some Big Bend bluebonnets. But, I didn't see any alligators, only lizards.

Travelers World is on left.

From the north on Hwy 281 (Interstate 37): Take Exit 135 (Military Drive) and go right (west) about 3 miles to Roosevelt Ave. Go right on Roosevelt 1.3 miles.

Travelers World is on left.

From the south on Interstate 37: Take Exit 135 (Military Drive) and turn left (west) go about 3 miles to Roosevelt Ave. Go right on Roosevelt 1.3 miles

Travelers World is on left.

From Interstate 10 coming from the east: Exit 574 onto Interstate 37 South (towards Corpus Christi). From Interstate 37, take Exit 135 (Military Drive) and turn right (west) go about 3 miles to Roosevelt Ave. Go right on Roosevelt 1.3 miles. Travelers World is on left.

From Interstate 10 coming from the west: Interstate 10 and Interstate 35 will merge in downtown San Antonio, and when they separate again, take Interstate 35 South towards Laredo. From Interstate 35 South take Exit 150B (Military Drive), turn left (under freeway) go about 3 miles to Roosevelt Ave. Turn left on Roosevelt 1.3 miles.


Editor's Note
