Winter Rally - Coleto Creek KOA, Victoria, Texas

The weekend of February 16-19th, 2017, Airstreamers arrived at the Victoria/Coleto Creek KOA. After severe weather sent several tornados through surrounding areas earlier in the week, the weekend brought sunshine and warmer temps. There was some rain in the forecast, but nothing too threatening. We have been to Victoria in the past and always enjoy the history of the area. Of course, THE GREAT COASTAL TEXAS BARBECUE TRAIL runs through here so we are anticipating lots of good BBQ. Victoria has a population of about 62,592. It is only 95 feet above sea level, so the grounds were saturated from the rains. The KOA has a great puppy park and a nice pool. Doubt we will try the latter due to cooler temps. Maybe next time. Wikipedia tells us "The city was named for General Guadalupe Victoria, who became the first President of Independent Mexico." Several missions were located in the city. These include, "The McNamera House, a social museum and THE NAVE, an art museum. It features seven artists and their creamics. The Coastal Bend Museum has wonderful displays of the multicultural heritage of the area. Many artifacts from La Salle's colony in the late 17th century are on display. Several days a week the archeological room is open to the public. Volunteers are going through things found from a recent dig. About 30 minutes away is the Presido La Bahia and Mission Espiritu Santo. It is one of the best preserved Spanish presidios in the country. Perhaps on another rally we can have one of the rangers come and talk with us, or do a group tour of the facility. Lots of history here. Makes me think of how things would have been different, had the French succeeded in their mission to take over the area.

Some did the driving tour of Victoria. Some got milkshakes at a little store in Fannin. Some toured the Coastal Bend Museum. After a dinner of beef stew, rolls, salad, cookies and ice cream; Rae gave an update on Searcy Kracke, Lyle Snow & Tonia Goodwin. Sadly, Tom Taroni developed influenza. He had volunteered to do a bird walk. We were excited as he really knows his stuff. Nice of him not to share his flu with us. Sure hope he can do this at another rally. The bird walk was cancelled. Ronn built a campfire, which was good despite the wet weather. The stars twinkled above, it was nice to be outside.

Goliad is said to be one of the oldest municipalities in Texas. The first Declaration of Texas Independence was signed here in 1835, and the "Bloody Am Flag" (the first flag of Texas Independence) flew over the town. I WOULD RATHER CUT OFF MY RIGHT ARM, THAN LIVE UNDER TYRANNY." However, it was during the 1836 Texas campaign that Colonel James Fannin surrendered at the Battle of Coleto on Palm Sunday. The Mexicans marched them out of the fort and shot them. This was THE GOLIAD MASSACRE. It was the largest single loss of life in the cause of Texas independence. There is a wonderful walking tour of this historic town AND THE GOLIAD BREWERY outside of town. Several folks visited the brewery and have the glasses to prove it. There is a beer garden there with scheduled svents throughout the year. There is also an online store. Check it out on google. The brewery is at 252 Metting Road. Fannin has a memorial to the placa where Colonel Fannin surrendered. I heard there was a little shop that had the best milkshakes on the square.

Saturday evening folks gathered in the rally room for social hour, and some music provided by Kathy Blanchard and Rae Gilbert. The "Airstream Song" was popular and many joined in singing with them. Dinner was pulled pork, tater tots, corn and coleslaw. All were saying they were so full that the hosts decided to wait for dessert until the evening game. I apologize to those of you who left and didn't return. I should have let you take yours with you. Those who stayed said they had a great time. We played HOLLYWOOD SQUARES. Nine of our group were the "CELEBRITY SQUARES"; and they were amazing! Fred & Sue, Bruce & Leslie, Kathy & Gene, Alan, Millie & Israel —thanks so much for your creative patticipation.
