
The President's Chair

Moment for Maintenance

This article presents a little different slant on maintenance for our membership, as I will not discuss specific maintenance issues. My intent this time is to encourage you to read the Blue Beret articles published monthly by the Airstream Tech Help Group chaired by Dave Schumann. Dave worked for the Airstream Company and, having retired, is now living the Wally Byam dream. He and his group have an immense body of knowledge to share with us. It is time well spent to study it in depth. My advice is to start your own notebook indexed with sections for the different subjects and cut and paste them in as they are published.

Other great resources are YOU TUBE and online tech forums. Here you can find videos and discussions for almost any repair from jacks to generators. I even found I could repair my electric step by replacing the OEM motor with a Lincoln car electric window motor much cheaper than the OEM part. Reading the tech help articles in other RV magazines can also solve many problems. And, don't forget your club buddies — just ask around when you have a problem.
